We take our name from the highest cliff on the South Coast of England – which offers breathtaking views along the coast. It is part of the Dorset and Devon World Heritage Site – the Jurassic Coast – which is an area of outstanding geological and palaeontological interest.

The Golden Cap Estate extends to more than 850 hectare and lies between the Devon border west of Lyme Regis and Lower Eype near Bridport, Dorset. It is of outstanding ecological and geological importance because of its considerable size and diversity.

Stonebarrow Hill is home to the National Trust's largest car park and open space on the Golden Cap Estate and is a wonderful starting point for walks on the Estate.

Our Region also includes the impressive hill forts at Eggardon Hill, Pilsdon Pen, Lamberts and Coney's Castles - all rich in archaeological remains - and the coastal areas of Burton Bradstock, Cogden, and West Bexington – all part of the dramatic and world renowned Chesil Beach.
